# 2018 WALLEYE FISHING TOURNAMENT

DAY EDITION • APRIL 14<sup>TH</sup>  
AT CHERRY CREEK RESERVOIR

## LOCATION

Cherry Creek State Park • 4201 S Parker Rd • Aurora, CO 80014

## LAUNCH SITE

West Boat Ramp

## HOURS

**Mandatory** rules meeting at 5:45am on April 14th prior to launch. At least 1 team member must be present at this meeting. The rules meeting will be held at the north end of the west boat ramp parking lot.

Tournament hours are from 7am to 3pm.

**Mandatory** – boats/anglers must be off the water by 5pm on 4/13 and not return until the event begins on the 4/14.

## WEIGH-IN

Weigh-In will be held on the marina docks at 3pm and the award ceremony will be in the parking lot.

## IF YOU CHOOSE TO NOT FISH UNTIL THE END OF THE EVENT

The weigh-in station will be in operation from 8am and remain open until the end of the event so if you wish to stop early you can weigh your fish at any time. Once you pull off the water you can not return.

## SINGLE FISH WEIGH IN

We promote conservation and do not want to harm any fish during these events. If you catch a fish and you fear for the fish's health you can drive your boat to the marina docks and weigh a single fish early. This fish still counts towards your bag/possession limit of 6. You can access the marina docks for weighing fish from 8am until the end of the event.

## Walleye Bag and Possession Limits/Size Limits

The daily bag and possession limit for Walleye at Cherry Creek is 3 Walleyes per angler. Each Walleye must be a minimum of 18" and of the 3 only 1 can be greater than 21".

As a team of licensed anglers each team can have up to 6 fish in the boat. Once you place your 6th fish in the boat you are done for the event and must head to weigh in. **THIS IS A NO CULL EVENT.** Once a fish is placed in your boat it can not be released.

## NOTE

The official measure board for this event is the EGO Measure Board. **MAKE SURE ALL FISH BROUGHT TO THE SCALE ARE WITHIN LEGAL LENGTHS AND LIMITS.** Bringing in short fish/long fish or greater than your limit will result in immediate disqualification.

## BOUNDARIES

Anglers may fish anywhere their boat will float but must follow are boating regulations including no boating zones, buoys, and no wake zones.

## SPEED LIMITS

Cherry Creek has a 40MPH Speed limit. Tournament rules enforce a strict 10MPH speed limit after dark. If you are caught breaking this speed limit or acting irresponsible or in a dangerous manner it will result in immediate disqualification. Tournament staff as well as Cherry Creek State Park Rangers can make this decision and all decisions are final.

## ANS INSPECTIONS/TOURNAMENT INSPECTION

All boats must go through and pass the mandatory ANS inspection provided by Cherry Creek State Park. Tournament staff will also be checking live wells, safety equipment (life jackets, throwable's, fire extinguisher, horn or whistle), and lights.

**A State Park pass is required for your vehicle to enter this park.**

## SPECIAL NOTES

Being under the influence of drugs or alcohol will remain cause for immediate disqualification from the tournament. No drug or alcohol use permitted during the event.

This event is open to all ages. Any participant under the age of 18 must have a parent or legal guardian sign the waiver. No one under the age of 16 is allowed to operate the vessel during tournament hours. Each boat is limited to two anglers. At least one of those anglers must be 16 years of age or older.

## PRIZES AND CANCELLATION

Prizes are based on a 40 boat field. If the 40 boat field is not met, then prizes will be adjusted by percentage according to full field percentages and pay out will not go as deep into the field. If there are less than 15 boats registered as of the Thursday preceeding the event at 5pm then the event will be rescheduled or canceled.

*Please note: Any errors on our fact sheets are not intentional. They will be corrected as soon as we are made aware of them. Anglers should refer to the official documentation for each lake or reservoir and know the rules for legal limits and allowed baits and fishing methods for any water they choose to fish.*
